GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS FOR URBAN & COMMUNITY PROFESSIONALS 1 (GIS UCP 1), GRADUATE MICROCREDENTIAL

The GIS UCP 1 graduate-level microcredential will introduce students to skills needed to apply geographic information systems (GIS) in government agencies, community organizations, companies, and other professional settings. These skills include spatial data collection and creation, projections, spatial database analysis tools, and cartographic design. It is intended to provide students familiarity with GIS software so that they can apply GIS in professional projects. The microcredential will provide a solid platform to build more detailed GIS skills and knowledge through additional classes or work experience.
